





# CLOSING THE GAPS IN TB CARE CASCADE



#### Background

The "TB care cascade" visualizes various stages of gaps in TB care delivery. The gaps represent patient losses in the ability to access a TB diagnostic test, receive an accurate diagnosis, register for appropriate TB treatment, adhere to daily medication, and remainTB-free posttreatment.

## Objective

The four year USAID supported project will implement quality improvement (QI) interventions to minimize the gaps across the entireTB care cascade.

Selected districts of Gujarat and Jharkhand

Interdisciplinary approaches to address care gaps:

- TB epidemiology
- Behavioral design
- Micro-experiments
- Digital learning
- Technology infrastructure (Nikshay)
- Value-based care

# QI models and activities

The project will prototype interventions in the TB patient care cascade aligned with the pillars of National Strategic Plan of NTEP.



- Engagement of informal providers
- Al-enabled Chest Xray integration
- Intensive case finding

Address barriers to treatment access

- Tracking patient mobility & migration
- Increased access to free treatment (FDCs)
- Optimized supply chain models



- Adherence Monitoring
- Enhanced care: Malnutrition, Stigma, ADR, Mental health
- Long-term follow-up



#### Strengthen health systems

- Patient triage & linkage to services
- Optimized workflows for healthcare staff
- Digital learning platforms

- Strengthened capacity of health system to monitor care cascade
- Enhanced Nikshay components for care coordination and decision-making
- Establish Quality Improvement Unit enabling scaling of care cascade monitoring for state-level impact
- Improved quality and equity of care along the entire patient pathway
